Ecology and Arts Camp

This camp combines the best components from our beloved SEED and arts camps from summers passed. Campers will spend part of their days enjoying ecological exploration, and the other part experimenting with various forms of art. Campers will be assigned to cohorts of no more than 12 children per session.



ecological Discovery

Sampling while gardening, like a golden raspberry ripe from the bush or the sweet crunch of a mouse melon, is a camper favorite! Our Big Garden, chicken coop, and fruit orchard invite students to explore biology and botany through sensory experiences. Our 10-acre campus is a certified wildlife habitat, offering a diverse spectrum of inhabitants to discuss and opportunities to practice environmental stewardship. Campers will see how our Virginia ecosystem changes week by week.

Exploring the **arts**

This camp is for the painters, the crafters, the weavers, and the lovers of all things art! Our 4-week sessions will allow campers ample time to explore a variety of mediums and techniques in our art studios. We place an emphasis on the process over the product to truly spark each individual's passion for creative expression.

Some cohorts will focus solely on visual art projects, while others will work on a blend of visual and aural arts. Aural arts will be introduced in the form of the Orff instruments and the ukulele. We will prioritize keeping household members together and children with similar dismissal times when assigning campers to cohorts.

Facilities

Our 10-acre campus is a green island conveniently located atop Pantops and is certified as a cooperative sanctuary with Audubon International and the National Wildlife Federation, equipped with playgrounds, gardens, a chicken coop, art studio, and a 850 square ft. geodesic growing dome with a 2,300 gallon aquaculture tank.

Each camp has a classroom and outdoor space to call home for the summer, an environment carefully prepared with materials to entice and inspire campers based on camp subject-matter.
