Cook with seasonal ingredients harvested straight from our Big Garden on campus. Our chicken coop provides fresh eggs for baking and a place to recycle kitchen scraps. Sampling while gardening, like a golden raspberry ripe from the bush or the sweet crunch of a mouse melon, is a camper favorite!



#### ecological exploration

Our 10-acre campus is a certified wildlife habitat, offering a diverse spectrum of inhabitants to observe and discuss. Our program creates opportunities for campers to develop strong connections within our living, ever-changing ecosystem, and to practice environmental stewardship.

#### **Nature** adventures

Venture into Virginia's local streams, farms, orchards, and forests on our bi-weekly field trips. Whether campers wade into cool waters at a natural pool, journey underground through a limestone cave, or enjoy lessons on herbalism while hiking, there are endless discoveries to be made at the beautiful sites we visit. Sites vary by week.


#### Two camps get smashed into one!

**Culinary Arts** Enjoy a cooking class that uses all of your senses. Campers will learn practical knife skills, measuring, how to follow a recipe, and the value of seasonal, fresh ingredients.

## the arts

#### Art Exploration July 1<sup>st</sup>-12<sup>th</sup>

Try your hand at ceramics by molding and glazing a plate before firing it in our kiln. Enjoy a diverse spread of fine arts crafting, including soapmaking, jewelry design, origami, beading, sculpey creations, and basket-weaving. Experiment in a variety of new mediums and techniques with an emphasis on the process.

#### Folk Art: Fusing Culture & Imagination July 15th-19th

Explore traditional folk art from around the world. Make a Guatemalan doll or a Japanese watercolor fan. Weave together a story quilt and build a whirligig. Discover the diversity of art across cultures by trying projects like the Hojalata tin art from Mexico or creating animals like those of Indian Gond art.

#### Mixed Media July 22<sup>nd</sup>-26<sup>th</sup>

With mixed media art goes beyond just a painting on a wall. Experiment with unique materials to create recycled sculptures, a project using found objects, or repurpose an old book. Create 3-D pieces like puppets or something new you dream up. Styles and techniques are combined to create truly original artwork.







## Elementary Classroom

Experience the full range of materials in the Montessori curriculum. Students delve into their favorite subjects while maintaining their academic progress of the previous year. They discover new interests in our art, music and movement studios, and our garden & greenhouse! The summer elementary classroom is offered at the end of summer, guided by members of our elementary faculty, and serves as a great way to begin the transition back to school.

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Open to current Mountaintop students, students attending another Montessori classroom in the upcoming academic year, or students who have previously attended a Montessori classroom within recent years.

## Facilities

Our 10-acre campus is a green island conveniently located atop Pantops and is certified as a cooperative sanctuary with Audubon International and the National Wildlife Federation, equipped with playgrounds, gardens, a chicken coop, art studio, and a 850 square ft. geodesic growing dome with a 2,300 gallon aquaculture tank.

Each camp has a classroom to call home for the summer, an environment carefully prepared with materials to entice and inspire campers based on camp subject-matter.
