The gala also includes a paddle raise, which gives families the opportunity to make an impact on a specific school need.

Previous paddle raises have funded Professional Development for guides and staff, the installation of picnic tables across campus, and the construction of Christy's Performance and Learning Space.

MOUNTAINTOP MEMORIES

Parents, staff, and local businesses are encouraged to host small, ticketed events to build community and raise funds for school. Past events have included wine tastings, a family camp out, and an escape room for kids. The Parent Association welcomes any ideas you might have for hosting a Memory and event details will be announced throughout the year.

OTHER OPPORTUNITIES

Families may be invited to contribute to additional causes and events throughout the year. Participation is always both appreciated and optional. These might include:
